

Welcome back everyone! Our school motto is **“Working Together with Jesus We Succeed.”** With Jesus as our guide, we strive toward excellence, cooperation, and success. The Cardinal and Theological virtues will be promoted this year as ideals for Christ-like behaviour. 
The virtue of focus for September will be Prudence. **Prudence allows us to recognize our moral duty to act with goodness in situations that confront us and allows us to make the right decisions.** Developing prudence also involves developing reflective, creative, and holistic thinkers which is one of our **Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations.**

Families are encouraged to discuss the virtue of prudence with their children. Books are available, for loan, at the school to support these discussions and they include “Goldilocks Returns” and “The Wolf’s Chicken Stew.” Please feel free to contact the school for further information on borrowing these items.

Together, we will continue to build a culture of acceptance and belonging within the school so that each student can have a sense of belonging within our community. The use of “Restorative Practices” at our school will engage learners and enable them to achieve to their true potential.

In partnership with **Father Laszlo Amaszka**, we have outlined our faith activities for the year. Class visits and monthly masses will help our students grow in their Catholic Faith. Sacramental preparation for our grade two students will lead to them making their **First Reconciliation on Sunday, March 25th (2:00 p.m.)**. They will then be more prepared to receive their **First Communion on Sunday, April 8th (2:00 p.m.)**. Our grade 7 students will

receive **Confirmation on June 3rd (2:00 p.m.)**. Father will also participate on our Catholic School Council. Students, parents and St. John staff enjoyed food, friendship, fun and learning all while building a sense of community. We had 50 SK to grade 5 students participate. We truly enjoyed the benefits the program brought to our students, including our Virtue theme. Literacy, numeracy board games, robotics and coding were also featured. Many resources, including a laptop cart with 40 new computers were purchased with program funds.

SCHOOL FUNDRAISING FOR 2017 - 2018

The main source of school fundraising the last three years has been to sell chocolate. Although very positive, we have decided to explore other options. Please make suggestions you may have to the office. Our worthy goals will include: technology enhancements and physical education equipment. Having a campaign early enables us to set priorities and budget accordingly.

BALANCING FUNDRAISING/SERVICE PROJECTS

As a school and CSC, we are trying to be aware of how much we ask of families to contribute financially. There is a need to balance competing interests and be reasonable in our requests. Between class trips, pizza day, pita day, popcorn and fundraising, the total amount can add up fast. As a Catholic Community, we are also called to help others in need, both within our community and abroad. Supporting our parish is also important.

Please know that we only ask what parents can afford and feel is appropriate. You are well within your right to pick and choose the causes you wish to support. While we are grateful for your participation, we will not pressure you. In addition, you should not allow your children to pressure you beyond your comfort level as well. Open conversations with them will enable them to understand your values and teach them to be responsible with money. Please contact the office if you ever have concerns.

NUTRITION UPDATE

We are excited that we will continue with 3 snack days on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays at morning recess. Breakfast club will be offered at 8:50 a.m. daily. Children will have the opportunity to grab a quick bite on the school yard or as they enter the building on indoor recess days.

COMMUNICATION AND AGENDA BOOKS

One of the best tools to help our children reach their full academic, social and spiritual potential is effective communication between home and school. Each child will receive an agenda book that is a useful source of information and communication. Our CSC has generously agreed to cover the cost. Please feel free to call your child's teacher to discuss any concerns or to relate any information (health, skills, etc.) you think would have impact on your child's learning or emotional well-being. The school office will also be happy to be informed as well.

VISITORS

Visitors to our school are asked to check in at the office. Please do not go directly to the classroom. If you are taking your child(ren) home early, kindly sign them out in the book at the office. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

BEFORE AND AFTER PROGRAM

We are pleased to announce that the YWCA has been given all approvals to start at St. John on the first day of school. Please visit our school website to obtain the [YWCA registration form](#). All communication and registration is done through the YWCA. Please contact the site Supervisor, Antonella Zezza at 905.547.5151 to book an appointment for registration.

NUT ALLERGIES

Once again, we will need to be a nut-sensitive school due to several students with such allergies. We appreciate your co-operation in not sending peanut butter or nut snacks to keep our school safe for those with a life-threatening allergy. Reminders of all allergies will be posted in the school to promote safety for all.

INFORMATION ABOUT MEDICATION

Information about medication (both prescription and non-prescription) is very important to the safety of students. If your child requires any type of medication that may need to be administered at school, please contact Mrs. Persia for the "Authorization Administration of Medication" form and return it ASAP.

Students with an *Epi-Pen* are required to have 2 *Epi-Pens* at school. One should be on the student's being (in the form of a pouch) and one is kept in a central location that all staff has access to. Waivers are available if these requirements are not favoured by parents. Also, be aware that it is important to keep us informed of any medical condition that may affect your child any time during the school year.

RESPONSIBLE USE OF ELECTRONICS

Our goal is to promote a safe learning environment and high standards of achievement for all students. The inappropriate use of electronic devices impeded this many times last year. Teachers experimented with a **BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE POLICY**, but too often devices were a distraction, instead of a learning tool.

We are fortunate to be able to provide a computer or iPad for each child whenever they are needed. Therefore, we have made the decision to restrict use of personal devices at school. If possible, it is best to leave them at home. If a student is going to bring in an electronic device, for safety reasons and to achieve our goal of high standards of student achievement, cell phones must be out of sight and turned off during the school day. Students are safe at school and parents are kindly asked to support this process by sending messages through the office.

As adults, we need to model and teach the responsible use of devices to children. The use of technology is the new normal, but we should not assume that children will understand how to use their devices appropriately and safely. So much can go wrong and fast; so as a school we reserve the right to manage technology and behaviour related to it within the learning environment. Please be advised that any issues that happen online (even at night) that originated at school can be subject to discipline at the school.

UNIFORM DONATIONS, PICK UP, OR SWAP

We will continue to accept the use of the old school logo. If you have uniforms that no longer fit your children, we would appreciate it if you would donate the uniforms to the school so we can distribute them as they are needed. We always have a substantial amount of gently used uniforms that are in good condition. They are available free of charge. Please visit the office to drop off unwanted items or to arrange a time to view the items.

ENVIRONMENTAL NEWS

Let's begin the new school year with best environmental practices:

- Walk or ride your bike to school when possible
- Pack snacks, lunches, and drinks in reusable containers
- Use our school hydration stations to fill up reusable water bottles

Join Pope Francis in celebrating "The Season of Creation" from September 1st until October 4th by praying and reflecting on creation and enhancing our role as stewards of planet earth.

The International Day for the Preservation of the Ozone Layer is observed on September 16th. We will participate on Friday September 15th at school, with students wearing hats and sunglasses when outdoors.

Remember to send in used batteries, ink cartridges, dried pens, and markers to school for recycling.

As a GOLD Certified Eco School for 9 consecutive years, we are very proud and honoured to do our best to take care of our planet, please continue to support our environmental initiatives. Coming soon: BAG2SCHOOL - collection of unwanted clothes, bedding, shoes, purses, belts, and soft toys.

UNIFORMS

Students are routinely coming to school out of uniform. Exceptions made from compassion and understanding translated into abuse by others. Uniform enforcement needs to be more consistent as a result. Families are being reminded of the rules to promote better compliance by all.

The following are the minimum items that make up the school uniform:

Bottoms: Navy blue only (casual “docked” style pants, walking shorts, skorts). “Kobe” pants, track pants, and spirit wear shorts were not approved. This will be enforced more strictly.

Tops: Navy blue or white (golf shirts, polo shirts, turtlenecks). CSC has insisted on school logos.

Sweaters: Please note that sweaters do not require school logos at St. John, but no hoodies are permitted.

NOTE: Visible T-shirts worn under uniform tops must be navy blue or white only.

Items can be purchased at Bombardieri or elsewhere if similar in style. Items can be brought to Bombardieri to have the logo stitched on. Alternatively, crests are available at the school at a cost of \$4. Parents must then sew the crest on to the shirt.

Some injuries incur medical, dental or other expenses that are not covered by provincial healthcare or employer group plans. As a parent, you become responsible for these expenses. SCHOOL MATERIALS

We are asking for parental co-operation in teaching responsible use of school materials such as textbooks and library books. We urge you to discuss the proper care and possession of the items they use. With rising replacement costs, we must charge for their loss or damage. An important lesson will be learned and resources will be available for learning.

SCHOOL TRIPS

Trips are specifically chosen by staff to enhance and reinforce the expectations of the curriculum. Therefore, all students are encouraged and expected to participate. The exclusion of a student from a trip may occur if the school feels that a student’s behaviour jeopardizes the safety or well-being of other students. Trips can also be used to motivate students to behave responsibly. In such cases, the goal is for the student, parents and school

staff to work together for the good of the student. We will endeavour to keep the cost of trips as low as possible. We will do our best to see that all students participate. Please contact Mr. De Tullio directly if finances are a problem.

MORNING YARD ROUTINES AND KINDERGARTEN DIRECT ENTRY AFTER PARENT CONSULTATION

After trial and error, consultation, and feedback we have settled on morning yard and Kindergarten entry procedures that promote the safety of students, enable flexibility for individuals, and keep parents off the sidewalk. Thank you for your patience and understanding during this process.

An area has been designated on the yard for parents to stay along the south fence, while their child plays. A line has been painted from the corner of the large gate toward the building. The line will serve as a visual reminder for students that this is a parent area. This narrow area will allow parents to conveniently walk across the yard and give them a place to gather and chat. This is intended to be more welcoming while still ensuring student safety.

Direct entry for Kindergarten students will continue as early as 8:50 a.m. as supervision is available. Mrs. Viscoso and Mrs. Bajus-Harrison will manage their entry at the south doors.

STUDENT VERIFICATION FORMS

To help keep our school records up to date, we are sending home *Student Verification Forms* next week. Please enter the correct information and return it to your child's teacher immediately. This information is extremely important as this data is needed in emergency situations. Please indicate to the office if you have changed your address, telephone number, emergency contact, or place of employment. All information is confidential.

CYO SPORTS

The CYO season will begin shortly with Cross Country, Football, and the girls Basketball season. Information from coaches will be distributed shortly. Coaches will collect a cheque to hold as a deposit for uniforms and shorts to ensure items are returned. A detailed note will be sent home as required.

PAPER COPY OF NEWSLETTERS

Although newsletters can be seen on our website, paper copies of newsletters will be sent home each month with the youngest child in the family, as many families will not take the time to view unless it is convenient. This practice could change if we get more subscribers, but it is most important that information is conveyed to all. Information may also be displayed as a link that can be viewed online.

RECESS AND LUNCH SCHEDULE - SJB

Times for the 2017-18 school year remain the same. The morning is from 9:05 a.m. - 11:50 a.m. and the afternoon is from 12:40 p.m. - 3:25 p.m.

LUNCH PROCEDURES

Students are strongly discouraged from leaving the school grounds during the LUNCH PERIOD unless they are going home for lunch on a **regular basis**. Please inform the teacher and the office with a signed note stating parent permission to leave. Routines and safety for all will be improved by returning the "SCHOOL LUNCH POLICY" note attached to this newsletter.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

The Hamilton-Wentworth Catholic District School Board (H-W.C.D.S.B.) collects personal information under the legal authority of:

The Education Act, The Ontario Student Record (O .S.R.) Guideline, 2000, and Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act.

During the school year, students will be involved in a wide variety of events and activities consistent with the purpose of educating students in accordance with the Education Act. For such events and activities, the school may receive requests for personal information such as the names(s) of parent/guardian, address, telephone numbers, from either the local parish, Catholic School Council, etc.

Such groups would include:

Local Parish

The H.W.C.D.S.B. works in conjunction with parish priests in the spiritual development of the students, including the celebration of the sacraments. For this purpose, pertinent personal information may be released to the parish for the purpose of arranging receipt of the sacraments and other religious occasions.

Catholic School Council

Catholic School Councils (parent advisory bodies) occasionally require information to communicate with parents.

Events/Activities

During the school year, it is the normal practice to publicize many of the positive things that occur at the school. This would include such things as:

- Student's work with their names, may be displayed in the classroom or school hallways, or may be shared with the public through science fairs, art projects, bulletin board displays, school newsletters, the school Web site, the Board's administration offices, board newsletters.
- From time to time, the press may come to the school and take photos of children and write articles about their achievements, graduation or special events. The information gathered is used as part of the school's communication plan in an effort to share newsworthy events that occur at the school.
- Photographs and videos of students, collectively or individually, may be taken and may be used in the following manner:
 - bulletin board displays in the classroom and in school hallways;
 - school yearbooks or school newsletter

- in classroom activities, during open house, parents' night, etc.;
- out-of-school learning experiences;
- may be shown to teachers for the purpose of planning activities;
- local newspapers and television stations.
- university based Faculties of Education - Internship Program
- Birthday congratulations to students (e.g. "Today is Ashley C's birthday") may be announced over the public address system and/or in the classrooms.
- Yearbooks may display names, grades and anecdotes about individual students.

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ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST SCHOOL LUNCH POLICY

Dear Parents,

To provide better supervision by school staff, it is necessary to clarify the lunch policy for the school. This policy can be divided into two parts:

A. BUS STUDENTS

It is understood that students who ride the bus to school will stay for lunch. Each of these students is expected to be at the school unless they have presented a signed, dated note to their teacher. No blanket permission forms allowing the student to go at their discretion or on certain days (e.g., every Friday) will be accepted. There must be a note for each occasion. Last minute arrangements cause confusion and extra work for all.

B. WALKERS

For students who walk to school, we are asking parents to make a decision as to whether your child will stay at lunch every day or go home every day. If you indicate that your child will stay each day, he/she must follow the same procedure as the bus students when planning to leave the grounds during lunch and bring a signed, dated note requesting permission to stay at school on a particular day.
